### 1. Motivo de Consulta (Chief Complaint)

The following questions and statements will help you when speaking with patients about why they have come to you for treatment.

Have you had these symptoms before?	¿Tuvo estos síntomas antes?	too-bo ace-tohs seen-toe-mahs ahn-tace
I am not sure.	No estoy seguro.	This is a patient response.
Yes, before my period starts.	Sí, antes de que me comenzó el periodo.	This is a patient response.
I can't remember.	No puedo recordar.	This is a patient response.
What have you done about it?	¿Qué ha hecho al respecto?	kay ah <b>ay</b> -choh all ray- <b>spake</b> -toe
I took (name of medication).	Tomé (name of medication).	This is a patient response.
I put heat on it.	Puse algo caliente.	This is a patient response.
I put cold on it.	Puse algo frío.	This is a patient response.
I went to sleep.	Me fui a dormir.	This is a patient response.
I bandaged it.	Puse una venda.	This is a patient response.
I rested.	Descansé.	This is a patient response.
I laid down.	Me acosté.	This is a patient response.
I covered my eyes.	Me cubrí los ojos.	This is a patient response.
I ate (name of food).	Comí (name of food).	This is a patient response.
I drank (name of drink).	Bebí (name of drink).	This is a patient response.
Nothing.	Nada.	This is a patient response.
Do any of your family members or	¿Alguno de sus amigos o	all- <b>goo</b> -no day soos ah- <b>me</b> -gohs oh fah-me-

friends have similar complaints?	familiares tiene malestares similares?	lee-are-ace see-mee-lahr-ace
Is anyone else in the house sick? (See the different family members in the list of nouns at the beginning of Course 2.)	¿Hay otra persona enferma en la casa?	ah-ee <b>oh</b> -trah pair- <b>so</b> -nah ain- <b>fair</b> -mah ain lah <b>kah</b> -sah
