Peter L. Berger says human life is narratively rooted, humans construct their lives and shape their world into homes in terms of these groundings and memories.

Stories are universal in that they can bridge cultural, linguistic, and age-related divides.

3. The Utility of Storytelling in Public Speaking

Because human life is narratively rooted, incorporating story telling into public speaking can be a powerful way of reaching your audience.

For example, communicating by using storytelling techniques can be a more compelling and effective route of delivering information than that of using only dry facts.
